

Official Opening For Penhesgyn Landfill Gas Power Generation Site

The new energy centre built by Clarke Energy at Penhesgyn Landfill Site has been officially opened and is now playing its part in the Regional In-Vessel Composting Facility and Landfill Gas Power Generation Plant. The centre was opened by Jane Davidson, Minister for Environment for the Welsh Assembly Government.
